DRAWING EVIDENCE		IMPROVEMENT ADVICE	
The reference points are too big and/or heavy. They haven't used them correctly.	<b>A1</b>	You don't need to make your reference points too obvious when draw them, draw them lightly. Use points to check the distances between objects.	
They haven't used angles or they've used them incorrectly. Measuring wrong.	<b>A2</b>	Angles, like reference points are quick ways to make sure you are drawing things correctly. Apply them very lightly to your drawing and they will help you to measure more accurately. Check yours over!	
Shading is clearly not right, even and neat. Or dark & light areas are clearly incorrectly placed.	А3	Whilst your shading has improved a lot, you still need to practice a little more, blending tones and defining edges. Make sure the light and dark areas are correct.	
Lack of detail.	A4	Some of your detail is a little bit lacking in the drawing. Spend some time adding more detail to improve.	
Select which are appropriate and circle them	<b>A5</b>	You are making huge improvements to your drawing, but I'd like to see you:  • Make your dark tones darker still.  • Remove the straight lines from the edges of shapes  • Spend some time blending tones neatly and smoothly  • Add greater detail  • Complete the drawing – it's worth it!  • Improve some of your measuring  • Work into the shadows and really bring them out.	
You observe a clear lack of confidence. Maybe they need to do some parts of the programme again.	<b>A6</b>	Don't be so hard on yourself. You have made great improvements on this course and you should be proud. There will always be people better than you are, learn to enjoy their work without comparing yours!
